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# FAQ

#### Who is eligible for IMPACcT?

Any interested current MS1 and MS2 students and incoming MS1 students are eligible.

#### How do I apply for participation in IMPACcT?

#### What are the advantages of participating?

- ♦ You will be placed with an ICE and ACE continuity preceptor at the Division of General Internal Medicine at 865 Northern Blvd in Great Neck who will remain your preceptor for three years.
- ♦ You will be provided with educational enhancement opportunities covering nationally recognized high-priority primary care topics through a series of afternoon educational sessions offered annually with residents, PA, pharmacy, and psychology trainees.
- ♦ Additional optional educational offerings will be provided at your ICE/ACE continuity site.
- ♦ Research opportunities will be offered during the MS1 summer and MS4 year.
- ♦ You will receive one-on-one residency and career mentoring by dedicated faculty.

#### How long will the program run?

This is a 4-year program (MS1 through MS4) with longitudinal mentoring. Current MS1 and MS2 students will be accepted into the program if interested. Though four-year commitment is expected, participants can leave the program early if desired.

#### What is the time commitment? Are extra hours required?

Attendance at four 3-hour educational sessions annually is expected, but not required for completion if you are unable to attend. Educational sessions will occur during afternoon hours. Besides these sessions, there are no additional requirements to the ICE and ACE continuity requirements.

### What will my role in the IMPACcT program be?

- ♦ You will be a founding member in an interprofessional educational and clinical program.
- ♦ You will provide primary care as part of an interprofessional team alongside residents, PA, pharmacy, and psychology trainees.
- ♦ You will participate in interactive educational sessions focused on behavioral health, PCMH, quality improvement, high value cost-conscious care, team-based care, health disparities, and medication management.
- ♦ Participation in interprofessional clinical huddles.
- ♦ If desired, you will take part in a quality improvement research project related to the IMPACcT clinic.

### How will IMPACcT affect my clinical schedule?

You will have a 3-year relationship with your ICE preceptor, who will become your ACE continuity preceptor. Your clinical schedule will not change.

### If I participate in IMPACcT, do I have to enter a primary care career?

No; this is a program to learn more about primary care, receive mentoring, and provide care as part of an interprofessional team.
